Welcome to the first newsletter of the River Cray Catchment Improvement Group.

We hope that you find this newsletter informative and we welcome all of your views and comments relating to the content and any other issues that you would like to tell us about the River Cray.

You are probably asking yourself, who are the River Cray Catchment Improvement Group and why was it formed?

The group is made up of several organisations that have an interest in improving the river for both people and wildlife.

Partners include Thames 21, the London Boroughs of Bexley and Bromley, North West Kent Countryside Partnership, Friends of Footscray Meadows, the Environment Agency, Darent River Preservation Society (DRiPS) and the Darent & Cray Catchment Consultative.

The key objectives of the group is to improve the ecological status of the river and to ensure that communities living and working along the entire length of the valley are given the opportunity to get involved in projects to improve this valuable local resource.

How can you get involved ?

As well as providing your thoughts and comments there are many other ways in which you can get involved in the projects that are happening on the River Cray.

Over the next year or so local organisations like the North West Kent Countryside Partnership and Thames 21 will be working in partnership with other organisations such as the World Wildlife Fund (WWF) to deliver an extensive range of river enhancement and habitat creation projects on several locations along the river.



We need your help to deliver this exciting programme of projects that will improve conditions for many species of wildlife from the smallest caddis fly up to the largest wetland bird such as the majestic heron.

No experience is needed to get involved as all the training and equipment will be provided, so if you have a few hours to spare and want to make a difference to your river please contact the Catchment Improvement Group and we will provide you with all the information that you will need.
